This was our final week of Winter Wonderland.



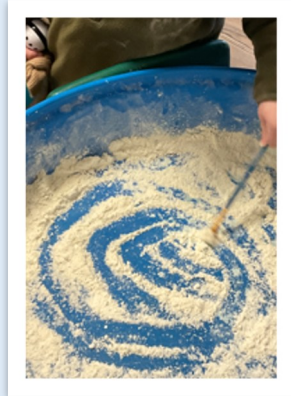
LITTLE DISCOVERERS

This was our last week of our Winter Wonderland topic and exploring all things cold. We looked at the story *Lost and Found* about a penguin and his friend.



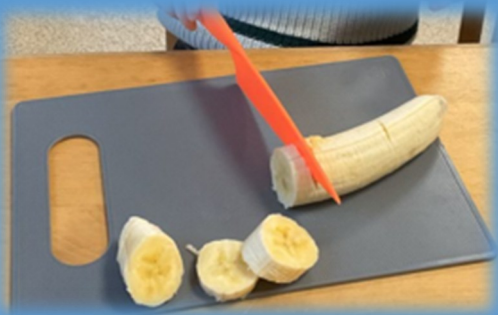
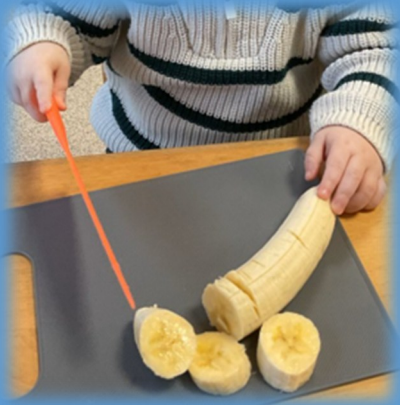
LITTLE VOYAGERS

Voyagers explored the story *'Lost and Found'* and explored the cold, ice and penguins this week. We also explored putting our coats on over our heads



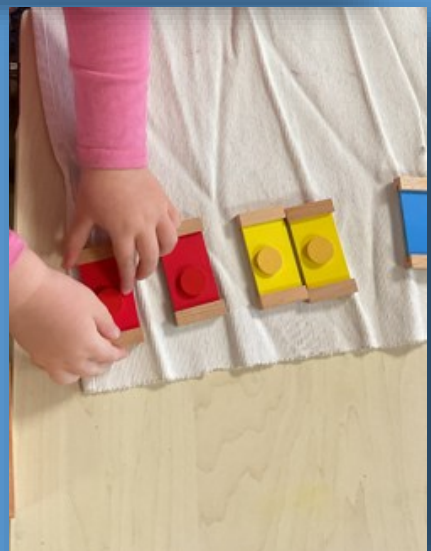
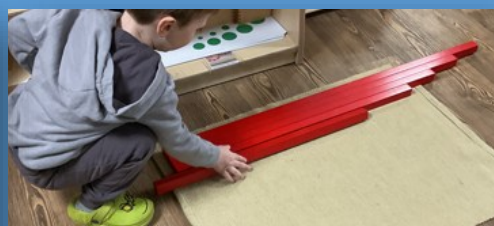
ANNA'S BAKING

The children have been working hard and progressing so well with their Montessori activities. We are so very proud of them.



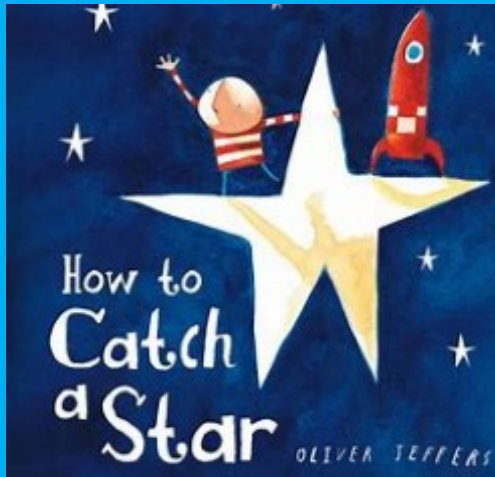


Themes and activities that we will be focusing on next week
